Olga Jean Sitarski, 89, of Brownstown, Indiana passed away at home peacefully on February 18, 2020. She was born June 2, 1930 in Lackawanna, New York to Edward and Helen Gorecki Pluta. On October 16, 1948, at Visitation Church in Buffalo, New York, she married Edward Sitarski, and he preceded her in death on November 14, 1990.
